About

The National Capital Area Council, BSA Adopt-a-School program is an exciting and comprehensive undertaking that will connect our Scouting programs across the DMV with schools in their communities. Participating Scouting units will partner with school administrations and offer the volunteer services that most effectively meet their school's needs within clearly-defined guidelines. With each unit offering their school a minimum one-year commitment, our intent is to create a mutual and meaningful community relationship that will bring signiificant positive changes within the schools. Units may use their service hours to count toward Journey to Excellence progress.



Project Scope

The National Capital Area Council, BSA Adopt-a-School is a project designed to proactively address our community/school relationships. Often we are made aware of significant access issues related to promoting and recruiting youth from within specific school systems. When the proverbial doors are closed, we endeavor to figure out additional means for youth recruitment.

Frequently Asked Questions

- · What is the time commitment?
 - We request a year's commitment, but our hope is to build strong sustained relationships.
- How much time is expected to be given?
 - At least 1 service project each school year.
- What commitment is expect from the school?
 - We expect the school representatives to be cooperative in identifying their needs and helping outline the projects that will best satisfy those needs.
- Can the Unit or School opt out if the commitment is not working?
 - Yes, but we hope both parties will do everything possible to honor the one-year pledge.

- Bring awareness of the program to the Unit through social media messaging, newsletter or email promotion, and Unit committee meetings
- Bring awareness of the program to community through social media, news media, etc. to help promote the image of scouting
- Provide resources to help facilitate communications with schools, families, and community
- Coordinate with District Adopt-a-School Chair to insure your unit had resources to engage with and recruit new youth at Adopt-a-School
- Coordinate day of support (unit level, commissioners, professional staff, etc.) to thank families for their involvement
