

2026 District Camp Card Chair Job Description SCOUTING AMERICA NATIONAL CAPITAL AREA COUNCIL

- 1. Camp Card Champion for District. Get at least ten units to sign up for the Camp Card Sale by **February 4**th, **2026**.
- 2. Attend Council Webinar on January 8th, 2026 @ 7PM.
- 3. Present information at your District Camp Card Kick-off and Roundtables, with the goal of sharing best practices and getting units thinking about their unit camping and program needs for the 2026 year.
- 4. Understand and communicate the impact that Camp Card sales have on Scouting at all levels.
 - a. Council Level
 - b. Unit Level
 - c. Youth / Parent Level
- 5. Understand the sale deadlines and youth incentive and how to fill out the paperwork/tracking forms.
- 6. Enthusiastically promote the sale to both *Unit Camp Card Chairs* and *parents*.
- 7. Work with District Executive to secure location and present at the District Camp Card Training Kickoff / Distribution the week of **February 8**th, **2026.** All materials will be distributed at your Distribution location.
- 8. Send out weekly communications to unit Camp Card Chairs, highlighting units that are having success.
- 9. Assist Unit Camp Card Chairs in securing storefronts for Camp Card sales.
- 10. Assist Units to secure additional Camp Cards as needed.
- 11. Help assist Unit Camp Card Chairs by reconciling their unit accounts between **April 10**th and **April 17**th, **2026. (Units with cards on consignment only)** This includes:
 - a. Collecting all money for sold cards and unsold cards not returned.
 - b. Collecting all unsold cards
 - c. Reconciling check out receipts.
 - d. Ensuring everything is turned in on time to NCAC.
- 12. Provide friendly reminders that the units keep their commission on the front end; 100% of unsold cards must be collected and turned in with payment; units are responsible for payment of sold cards and any unsold cards not returned. (Note: If a unit pre-buys 100 cards, at the 70% commission, the unit has already settled account.)
